

Rotaract is a service club for men and women aged 18 and above who are dedicated to finding innovative solutions to the world's most pressing challenges while developing professional and leadership skills.

History

First chartered Rotaract Club is on March 13, 1968: Rotaract Club of North Charlotte

From 1930s to 1950s, there were many youth organisations/clubs sponsored by Rotary Club based on Rotary principles

Many Interactors (Interact was formed in 1962) who reached the age limit of that program, were starting new types of clubs called "Senior Interact".

In 2019, Rotaract went from being a program of Rotary International to being a membership type of Rotary International, elevating its status to resemble that of Rotary clubs.

Usually taken as extracurricular activities for self and professional development through service

For youths who would like to have a platform to impact changes in their communities







- Good practice to send file on meeting agenda at least three days prior





Meeting Minutes

- Serve as a reminder aid for participants that have attended the meeting (allow them to follow up on the actions)
- Will be helpful to those who are absent to know what was discussed in the meeting
- In any case of conflict, meetings can be referred back to know what agreement was made previously





Rotaract Policy Updates



1. Rotaract Policy Update which will take effect on 1 July 2022 onwards

Key decisions about Rotaract from the January 2020 Board meeting

In January 2020, the Board of Directors of Rotary International made additional decisions related to Rotaract, based on a survey of Rotaractors:

Rotaract clubs will begin paying dues to Rotary International 1 July 2022. The annual dues will be \$5 per member for university-based clubs and \$8 per member for community-based clubs. The \$50 one-time fee for chartering a new Rotaract club will be eliminated.

2. Rotaract Policy Update which will take effect on 1 July 2022 onwards

Key decisions about Rotaract from the June 2020 Trustees meeting

In June 2020, the Trustees of The Rotary Foundation made the following decisions about Foundation policy regarding Rotaract:

- Beginning 1 July 2022, Rotaract clubs will be allowed to be either international or host sponsors of global grants, if they have previously partnered with a Rotary club on a global grant.
- The Trustees confirmed that no rights or privileges that Rotaractors had as participants of a Foundation program will be revoked.



What is a Global Grant?

What global grants support

Global grants can fund:

- Humanitarian projects
- Scholarships for graduate-level academic studies
- Vocational training teams, which are groups of professionals who travel abroad either to teach local professionals about their field or to learn more about it themselves

How they're funded

Global grants have a minimum budget of \$30,000 and a maximum World Fund award of \$400,000. Grant sponsors can use a combination of District Designated Funds (DDF), cash, and/or directed gifts and endowment earnings to fund a global grant. The Foundation will provide a 100 percent World Fund match for all DDF contributions. There is no minimum World Fund match.

Qualification

Both the district or club in the country where the activity is carried out and the international partner district or club must first become qualified before applying for a global grant. Learn more about the qualification process and grant management. Your club and district Rotary Foundation chairs can help you plan how to use your District Designated Funds and learn how to qualify your club.
