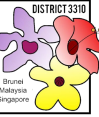

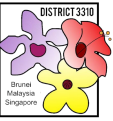

- D. through our fellowship of business, professional and community leaders

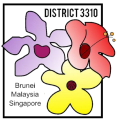


## What is Rotaract?

Rotaract is a service club for men and women aged 18 and above who are dedicated to finding innovative solutions to the world's most pressing challenges while developing professional and leadership skills.

**Rotaract stands for: Rotary in Action**

**Motto: Fellowship Through Service**



# History

First chartered Rotaract Club is on March 13, 1968: Rotaract Club of North Charlotte

From 1930s to 1950s, there were many youth organisations/clubs sponsored by Rotary Club based on Rotary principles

Many Interactors (Interact was formed in 1962) who reached the age limit of that program, were starting new types of clubs called “Senior Interact”.

In 2019, Rotaract went from being a program of Rotary International to being a membership type of Rotary International, elevating its status to resemble that of Rotary clubs.



On the campus of the University of North Carolina, members of the world's first Rotaract club inaugurate a new, long-term project. They'll plant a young tree to honor each new Rotaract country and its first club. Usually taken as extracurricular activities for self and professional development through service

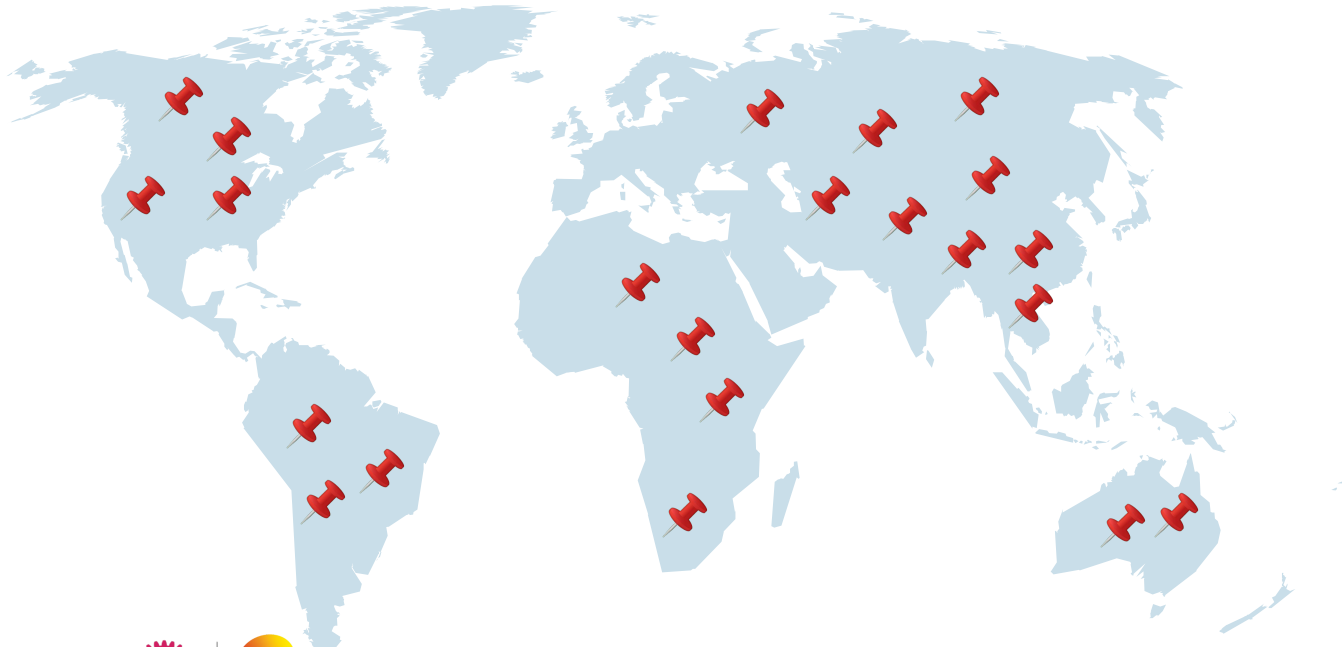
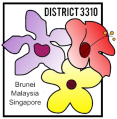

For youths who would like to have a platform to impact changes in their communities



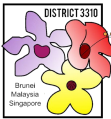

## Roles

- Equip Rotaractors with new skills and knowledge that can help them in their professional lives
- Learning new skills, Upskilling existing skills, Better understanding of your industry

## How To Plan A Project



## Step 1: Planning

Identify gaps and interests in your community:

- What fields are most of my members in?
- What are my members interested in?
- Are there any skills that would be helpful for my members in their future careers?
- Are there a lot of changes in the field your members are in?





## Step 1: Planning

- Talk to members to gauge interest and get ideas
- Talk to your committee members to discuss your ideas and their feasibility
- Do research

You might not know enough about the industry either, and that's okay, that's just another reason to run a professional development event



## Step 1: Planning

### Have a clear end goal

- What do you want to achieve? Visualise what a successful takeaway from your event would be
- Have a few metrics for success:
  - Minimum n number of participants
  - Well organised event – adherence to proposed timeline and deadlines







## Step 2: Organising

### 1. Identify the relevant stakeholders:

- Who do you need to make this event happen – guests, volunteers, helpers
- What do stakeholders need from you – event information, delegation of tasks

### 2. Set up deadlines and delegate tasks:

- Set deadlines with some leeway to prepare for future delays or mishaps
- Split tasks between members to ensure everyone fully understands their role





## Step 2: Organising

### 4. Communicate frequently:

- Provide periodic updates, let people know what is going on
- Overcommunication is better than undercommunication

### 5. Empathise:

- Think about what others need from you in order to do their tasks more effectively
- Designers need event details from organisers, volunteers need direction to carry out event the way organisers want to
- Improve overall quality of event if everyone has all the tools needed to do their job effectively





## Step 3: Post Mortem

- Gather feedback
  - From volunteers, participants and organisers
  - What went right/wrong? Do I feel satisfied with my contribution in this project? What events do I want in the future?
- Look at the feedback and the project as a whole - was the project successful in achieving the set goals?
