From 1930s to 1950s, there were many youth organisations/clubs sponsored by Rotary Club based on Rotary principles

Many Interactors (Interact was formed in 1962) who reached the age limit of that program, were starting new types of clubs called "Senior Interact".

In 2019, Rotaract went from being a program of Rotary International to being a membership type of Rotary International, elevating its status to resemble that of Rotary clubs.

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

Thank you very much for considering our projects to start training and helping the girls in our community. The current pandemic situation is very worrisome as the community is suffering due to job loss, no savings, heavy debt burden and lack of accessibility to sell their produce in the market outside the villages due to movement restrictions. By adopting the projects, this will allow girls who are most at risk to human trafficking to help their families, be self-sufficient and gain new life skills.

Below please find the budget plan for each project, namely:

- 1. Hunger Poverty (Junior Chicken Farmers);
- 2. Nutrition Poverty (Fish & Veg Farmers) and;
- 3. Health Poverty (Masks & Sanitary Pad Makers)

For the above project, we will select a team of 5-7 girls (between 15-18 years old) to work with your teams. And we would be happy to assist and answer any question that the members may have pertaining to the projects and to make the projects successful.
